Day 13 – Jan 25 | A Channel of Hope and Supernatural Help

1. Lord, we thank you for past open doors in our personal, family and church life and for the privilege of opportunities to bring hope and supernatural help in the form of the exquisite fragrance of Christ to those around us (2 Corinthians 2:12-17)
2. Lord, continue to open good doors for me, my family and the Hilltop. Doors of opportunities to bring hope and supernatural help, that cannot ever be shut (Isaiah 45:1, Revelation 3:7-8)
3. Lord, empower us to be God's epistle written in the ink of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of all around us to bring everyone into God's greater glory (2 Corinthians 3:3-11)
4. Lord, specifically open to us doors for the preaching of the gospel of Christ and for salvation of souls by the power of the Holy Spirit (Colossians 4:3, Acts 2:42-47)
5. Lord, we are supernaturally released from all limiting situations (frustration, sorrow, pain, failure, poverty, bondage and the like) that have previously blocked our access to opportunities to be channels of hope and supernatural help (Acts 12:6-11, Psalm 24:7-10)
6. 7. Lord, we declare that our steps are ordered by the Holy Spirit, so we are therefore shielded from any of Satan's camouflaged unfruitful agents and opportunities (Psalm 37:23, 2 Corinthians 11:12-15, Proverbs 14:12)
8. Lord, we declare that as we take advantage of opportunities to bring hope and supernatural help, we step into hidden treasures, secret riches and uncommon favor (Psalm 90:17, Isaiah 45:3)
9. Lord, we declare that your open doors will bring us to our individual and corporate places of satisfaction, enduring service, stability, strength and safety (1 Corinthians 12:27, Psalm 91:16)
