KEEP FAITH ALIVE

Scripture: James 2:14-23



*"By faith Abraham when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son"
Hebrew 11:17 (KJV)*

Faith is absolute confidence in God and in the power of His word. God operates in the eternal realm, outside of time; therefore, with God, there is no yesterday or tomorrow. However, the manifestation of God's action in the physical realm happens in time. Thus, we may receive today what God has already given to us yesterday. Therefore, delay in time does not mean that God has not answered or that we have not received, rather, we need to speak and act like we already have it.

Let your faith be manifest in your actions. When you have prayed and believed God for something, your actions must indicate that you believe God has answered. If you have prayed for rain, then act like one expecting rain. If you believe God for a job, start preparing for work. Take steps that activate your faith. Abraham believed and trusted totally in God enough to sacrifice his only son. He acted in faith and God confirmed his action.

What do you believe God for? A child, a job, or finances? Remember God is always faithful and will never withhold any good thing from you. Exercise your faith, take actions based on your expectation, obey the instructions that God gives you as proof of your faith and that which you believe for will become your physical experience. Your faith without corroborating action is dead.

BE EXPECTANT

Scripture: Mark 5:21-29

"For surely there is an end; and thine expectation shall not be cut off." Proverbs 23:18 (KJV)

Expectation is a sense of anticipation. Expectation proceeds from faith; an absolute confidence that something will happen and you look forward to it. God has massive plans for your life but as you believe this, you also have to expect it to happen.

The woman with the issue of blood made an effort to touch Jesus' garment by all means because she had an expectation. She was not simply looking to get his attention, she expected that a touch would heal her and she got what she wanted. Most people in that day were aware of Jesus' power to heal all diseases but how many of them expected a miracle just by touching his clothes? His clothes must have brushed against thousands of people as he passed through the crowd but it was the woman who expected healing by that singular act of touching his clothes that got her desire.

It is good thing to pray for God to help you but it does not end there. After committing your cares and issues to him, you have to act in faith. Be expectant of your miracles and do not be careless about it. At every point in time, your words and actions should portray your expectation. You must take action that pushes you close to receiving your miracle. Just like little children have full confidence in their parents to feed, clothe and take care of them you should also have full confidence in God to deliver your answer.

HEED THE WORD

Scripture: Proverbs 3:1-5



*"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."
Psalm 118"105 (KJV)*

You are open to mistakes and failure when you are not properly guided. To avoid mistakes and regrets, many people get the services of professional counsellors when they are about to make important choices and decisions in life. But sadly, as helpful and supportive as counsellors are, their services do not guarantee an error free life. The surest and only antidote to an infallible life is to heed the Word of God.

GOD SPEAKS

Scripture: Numbers 22:22-35

*"Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip."
Hebrews 2:1 (KJV)*

God spoke in the Old Testament dispensation through his prophets and dreams. Today, he speaks to us through his word and the Holy Spirit but many believers complain that God does not speak to them.

God is still in the business of speaking and communicating with us and he does so via various means. Sometimes, he speaks through circumstances, the bible or through dreams. At other times, he could speak through the Holy Spirit, a prophet or even friends. Whatever the means he chooses, the important thing is that we listen and heed his voice. The onus, therefore, is on us to learn and identify his voice when he speaks.

How does the Lord speak to you? How often you hear from him is a function of your relationship with him. The closer you get to him, the easier it becomes to know and differentiate his voice from the distractive noise of reason. Take time to develop a routine that allows quality time spent in study of God's word. And when he does speak to you, commit to acting on his direction. You can count on God never to lead you astray or into error. When he speaks to you, do not let the voice of logic or reason cause you to act in disobedience. Listen and follow and he will lead you to your peace.

WHO IS GOD TO YOU?

Scripture: Matthew 16:13-20



*"He said unto them, But whom say ye that I am?"
Matthew 16:15 (KJV)*

As a new believer, you will need to consistently hear others talk to you about God so as to grow in your faith. It is also equally good to feed on the word of God from gospel messages (audio/videos), preachings at church services and through the experiences and testimonies of other believers. But you must have a personal knowledge of who he is.

Jesus asked the disciples, not just about who others thought he was but who he was to them. His desire was to let them know that their walk with him should not be based just on what others say about him, but should be based on a personal revelation and perception of him. By extension, it can be deduced that though you need others to grow our faith walk with God, there comes a point where you must be able to say for sure, who He is to you, based on your experiences and encounters with Him.

Who is God to you? How do you perceive or see Him? And what informs your idea or opinion about the nature of God? To truly know God, you have to hunger for Him. Diligently seek Him and He will reveal Himself to you. Your personal time should not just be for asking things of God, but also seeking His will concerning everything you are engaging in. Take time to study the Bible and meditate deeply on what you read. Above all, get filled with the Holy Spirit and speak in other tongues regularly.

UPLIFT OTHERS

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 1:3-11

"But continually encourage one another every day, as long as it is called 'Today' [and there is an opportunity], so that none of you will." Hebrews 3:13 (NIV)

Feedback: Consider what it will take to actualise your 2018 goals.

People are faced daily with challenges in different areas of their lives. They strive to make sure that things are placed in the right perspective – family, faith, finance and relationships. Believers are not immune to the pressures that come from meeting these obligations and it can be very discouraging whenever they are not met.

Paul made it clear that we should always encourage each other in every way possible so that we will not be enticed into sin because of the temporary hardships in life and ministry (Hebrews 3:12-14). The body of Christ is a family. We are one and must always be a source of strength to one another. If your brother or sister makes a mistake you should be the first to pick them up (2 Corinthians. 1:4b). Let it be done in love and without blame.

The bible reminds us that time and chance happens to us all (Ecclesiastes 9:11b). Therefore, hardship and challenges can strike anytime, anywhere and on anyone. But our advantage is that we always have victory through Jesus (1 Corinthians 15:57). Allow this victory to be fully expressed by being a source of help and encouragement to the body of Christ. Do not be the one to tear them down in challenging times. As you uplift others, God will ensure that you never lack helpers in your life.

Reflection: What is my role in helping and encouraging others.

HAVE FAITH

Scripture: Matthew 14:22-33



"But those who wait for the Lord [who expect, look for, and hope in Him] will gain new strength and renew their power; They will lift up their wings [and rise up close to God] like eagles" Isaiah 40:31 (NIV)

Faith in God is a must! Any man that wants to respond to the issues of life with only physical and natural strength is in for a very rough ride. We need to have faith in God so that we can always have the necessary strength to overcome. Challenges come every day that attempt to lure one away from faith in God, but you must stand tall and never give in.

The tribulations of life are real. One may encounter it but what does God's word say concerning them? The storm that hit Jesus and his disciples was real. His disciples were afraid of what will be their final outcome. However, Peter recognised the sovereignty of Jesus over the storm and put his trust in him. This gave him victory. He later lost focus taking his eyes away from Jesus to look at the waves which caused him to start sinking (v24-30).

What are those promises the Lord has spoken to you about? Are you sticking to them or are you allowing the storms of life to carry them away? Without faith, it is impossible to get anything from God (James. 1:5-7). When you lose faith like Peter, you will become overwhelmed by the storm; but if you keep your eyes on the Lord in constant faith and depend on his help you will overcome the storm. Have strong faith in God and never doubt He will surely save and strengthen you (Isaiah 40:31).

FIRMLY ROOTED

Scripture: Matthew 16:5-12

*"And he said, Take heed that ye be not deceived."
Luke 21:8 (KJV)*

A believer who is not firmly rooted in the knowledge of God and his word will become easily deceived. This is because the devil is always on the move in search of those to destroy. A scripture starved believer can easily fall prey to the deceptive schemes and teachings that the devil effectuates through his agents who often appear as children of light.

When you are a condition based believer in God, your faith in God is solid only when all is well in your life. When challenges come you waver. The devil seeing that your faith is weak and threatened, charges in and sows seeds of doubt and deceit in your heart through false teachings. You must remain vigilant lest you be swayed. Jesus emphasized this when he warned every believer to abstain from the yeast of the Pharisees (Matthew 16:11-12).

It is important to guard your heart diligently because the days are evil. Beware of false teachings and enticing words that play to your circumstances. Become knowledgeable in God's word so you can discern and sieve through the chaff of false teaching and deceit of the enemy. Whatever happens, never let your faith in God be threatened and never try to seek help outside God's fold. God is forever faithful and his word are ye and amen. Stay firmly planted in his word and you will not be deceived or led astray.

UNDER CRITICISM

Scripture: Matthew 11:16-19



*"We played the pipe for you and you did not dance;
we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn."
Matthew 11:17 (NIV)*

Success has many friends but can also buy you a lot of enemies. There will be people who will criticize and speak ill of you and your efforts no matter how good your intentions are or how well you perform. Your first thought may be to fight back but this is not always the best option.

Jesus experienced verbal attacks and more during his ministry on earth. While the bible records that he went about doing good, many were not pleased with his actions and sought to make light of his accomplishment. When people attack your good works, their purpose is to discourage, dissuade and put you down. They thrive on their negativity making you feel inferior. You cannot please everyone. Some will love you for the good you do, others may hate and envy you. Even Jesus faced the same challenge (v18-19). The moral and beauty of it all however, is that if you remain faithful and persist in your good works, at the end, you will be victorious.

Do not become discouraged when you experience verbal assault. Refuse to let the negativity projected by the enemy hinder your good work. If you do not let them win by becoming discouraged, your results will speak in the end (v19b).

UNFORGIVENESS: A TRAP

Scripture: Matthew 18:21-35

"And forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us." Matthew 6:12 (NLT)

When we keep a diary of the events that occur in our lives, there is a tendency to also keep a record of our hurt. We bury the pain deep in our hearts refusing to let go especially when it is caused by the ones we love and hold close to us.

Our scripture today recounts the incident of a servant who failed to pay his debt but was forgiven by the creditor when he pleaded for pardon. When, however, it fell on him to extend the kindness he had enjoyed to another who owed him, he refused and punished his debtor. When we are unwilling to forgive people who have hurt us, we make light of Christ's sacrifice for us on the cross. He paid the price that would purchase our forgiveness while we were still held down by the weight of sin. He forgave us even before we said we were sorry. We must act likewise to those who hurt or offend us.

You need to allow your old life or man be crucified with Christ if you still live in unforgiveness (Galatians. 2:20). You must always forgive totally just like he forgave and prayed for those who hung him on the cross. Jesus' action on the cross is a reminder that no offence is too grave to forgive. Just as he let go, you too can do the same. As long as you have breath in you, you will be offended but because you have the mind of Christ, the ability to forgive is already inside of you. Do not be caught in the trap of unforgiveness.

Lord, I receive the power to forgive at all times without holding back in Jesus name.

FAITH BYTE

I forgive outrightly when offended without keeping grudges.



FOLLOW CHRIST COMPLETELY

Scripture: Matthew 16:24-28



"The Jesus said to His disciples, "if anyone wishes to follow Me [as My disciple], he must deny himself [set aside selfish interests], and take up his cross..." Matthew 16:24 (AMP)

What does it mean to be a Christian - a true follower of Christ? Many people can only be identified as Christians when you check up their bio-data on forms, other official documents or simply by their routine attendance of church services on Sundays. That is not Christianity and it is certainly not how Jesus expects us to follow him (Matthew 16:24).

To be a true follower of Christ, you must let go your bad habits and appetites (Matthew 16:24a). You must submit yourself in complete rather than partial obedience to God and then practice the teachings and principles of God's word. A godly and fruitful Christian life is possible but does not happen automatically as soon as you become born again (1 John 5:1-3). You must first commit to it and pursue it with consistency and faithfulness. It is a process that every genuine believer must desire and pursue.

Does your lifestyle announce you as a follower of Christ? Have your old habits become a stumbling block in your pursuit of a fruitful Christian life? Have you taken up the cross of sacrifice serving God and others in and out of your comfort one? You cannot profess to follow Christ when you have not denied yourself the pleasures of your old habits and appetite. Following Jesus is not what you do only when it suits you and is convenient. It is a minute by minute, daily and everytime commitment to God. Make the decision to follow Christ completely today and He will surely reward you for it (Hebrews 6:11).

FAITH BYTE

GIVE THANKS

Scripture: Matthew 15:32-39

"And he took the seven loaves and the fishes, and gave thanks, and brake them, and gave them to his disciples and the disciples to the multitude" Matthew 15:36 (KJV)

Thanksgiving is a very powerful tool in the arsenal of a Christian. A heart of profound gratitude to God for what he has done and will do creates an atmosphere for answers to prayers (Phillipians 4:6b).

Jesus demonstrated the power of thanksgiving when he fed thousands of people with five loaves of bread and some fish. Some of the greatest miracles Jesus wrought were done on the grounds of thanksgiving. Lazarus rose from the dead after Jesus gave thanks to the Father and he did the same when his disciples confronted him with the challenges of feeding the multitude (v36). He simply gave thanks and thousands of hungry men, women and children were fed with 12 basketful of left-overs.

Have you become so weighed down by the challenges of life that you have overlooked God's command to you to give thanks no matter what (Ephesians 5:20)? Complaining about your circumstances is also not a solution to them. Thanksgiving is the anti-dote to every misery, it can bring every seemingly dead situation back to life. While it may seem that the door of breakthrough remains closed to you, refuse to give in to the misery and dejection that your circumstance calls for. Give thanks to God in the hallway of waiting and in time, your answer will be delivered to you.

*"But godliness with contentment is great gain."
1 Timothy 6:6 (NIV)*

Feedback: Did you visit and encouraged someone this past week?

When we switch on our televisions, surf the internet or walk out into the streets, we are bombarded with advertising gimmicks from sellers to buy the next trinket or electronic gadget, attend the most exciting programme or send our children to the best school or programme in town. These can overwhelm our senses and pressurize us into a state of constant insatiability where we are never satisfied with what we have or where we are because there is always the next best thing to do or own.

The bible reminds us that not being satisfied with what we have can bring up evil desires in us and because of the corrupt nature of the flesh, we might be pushed to take actions that are not godly just to satisfy our desires. As we crave success, we should not allow our needs or the love of worldly desires get the upper hand in our lives. Being content with what we have is a virtue that we must covet and possess as Christians because it displays our trust in God to supply our needs.

God has given every Christian the dominion and authority required to prosper in the land but it is in God's time that he makes all things beautiful in our lives. We should not let delay or the desire to be like the Jones' push us to stray from what is right or to wander from the faith. We should endeavour to make do with what we have presently. We should spend time each day recounting our blessings and give God gratitude for what we have. Remember, the earth is His and the fullness thereof, He will perfect all that concerns us and provide what we need.

Reflection: Am I grateful for what I have and where I am?

YEARN FOR THE KINGDOM

Scripture: Matthew 13:44-52

*"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness;
and all these things shall be added unto you."*

Matthew 6:33 (KJV)

In many of Jesus' teachings, the kingdom of God is compared to everyday events - activities and things we can relate to. A consistent theme across these illustrations is the truth that every believer has a part to play to enjoy the kingdom of God. The discovered treasure hidden in a field, a merchant's quest to find choice pearls, and several other parables about the kingdom of God drives home this point (Matthew 6:33).

God's love for us - His children cannot be overemphasized. In our worst state, when we deserve the worst, He sent His Only Begotten Son; His most precious to die so we can be saved, be entitled to our lost dominion mandates and eventually, enjoy eternity with Him. But all this is open to us, if only we seek first the Kingdom of God and all His righteousness. Nothing pleases God more than seeing His children doing His will worshipping and Him in spirit and in truth.

To spend eternity with God, we must place utmost value on doing the will of God, and living our lives to please Him rather than ourselves. God has left us with the power of choice; to take advantage of a life of redemption or remain in sin and despair, far from His glorious light and eternal happiness. Has the cares of life kept you away far from God? Has sin being an obstacle to your walking in the will of God? One of the strongest traits of a child's character is humility. Every child tends to love and trust everyone. They hold no grudge and seek a cordial relationship with everyone. This is the same attitude and lifestyle God expects from every Christian. Infact, Jesus said if we do not become a children, we will not enter the Kingdom of heaven (v3)

What then does it mean to be humble? It means not seeking self glorification, esteeming others better than yourself, giving respect to all and obeying all authority (Phillipians 2:3-8). A SERVANT IN SERVICE

Scripture: Matthew 20:25-28

*"Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness."
Philippians 2: 6-7 (NIV)*

Leadership is about serving others. Many who seek positions of authority lack the basic requirements needed to function effectively in such positions. They seek to exercise power over their followers and demand loyalty but lack the depth and care to help others attain success and growth.

Scripture: Matthew 20:1-16

"Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? To his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for God is able to make him stand." Romans 14:4 (KJV)

Every one of us is called to serve a unique purpose in the house of God – the church. It is expedient that you focus on your core duty in the house of God; not comparing yourself with anyone else, or trying to do what everyone else is doing rather than what you are called to do. It does not matter how huge or minute your contributions are; or how much value others place on your work. What matters is for you to stay focused and diligent in calling, not expecting rewards or recognition from man, but from God.

Do not be dismayed, know that God is right there (Psalms 145:14). He is standing by you now ready to step in. Maintain a right standing with God. Call on him in the day of trouble and he will come to your aid.

Judas was one of the disciples of Jesus. He walked with Jesus, saw the miracles that Jesus performed and deep down in Judas' heart, he must have known that Jesus is the son of the living God. But this knowledge did not deter him from carrying out his evil plans against Jesus with the religious leaders of his time. The leaders saw a weak link in Judas and collaborated with him to arrest Jesus.

They wonder why prophecies remain unfulfilled and prayers seem unanswered but God encourages you not to give in to fear because he has a plan for you.

God answers prayers. This means that your need for deliverance, salvation and healing is not an issue where God is concerned (Jeremiah 32:27). The challenge lies in how a believer acts to access these benefits. The answer is to connect or plug in to God's omnipotent power. Just like the electrical appliances in your home need a power source to function, you also need to stay plugged into God's power to enjoy the reality of His promises in your life.

The key scripture today recounts how Daniel consistently prayed for three and received his answer. Daniel could have been discouraged by delay and given up but he did not. Despite the delay, he stayed plugged in and it paid off. Do not run around or away from God when trouble comes; remain with him like Daniel no matter the storm.

The key to getting and staying plugged into the power of God is to remain focused on him and his word. Do not waver (Proverbs 4:25). Do not entertain fear. Fear quenches your fire and drowns your faith and commitment. In the darkness of discouragement, the devil attacks. Resist and refuse to fall into this trap. Whenever a man is steady and stable, God is ready to work with him to victory. Remain plugged in.

Reflection: What am I doing to remain plugged into the power of God?

THE ENLIGHTENED HEART

Scripture: Ephesians 1:15-19

"I pray that the eyes of your heart be enlightened in order that you may know the hope of which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints." Ephesians 1:18 (KJV)

A heart that is not in tune with the spirit of God cannot hear or receive from God. To tap from God, your heart must be illuminated. An illuminated heart is that which is enlightened with God's thoughts, visions and plans. An enlightened heart is also a heart that is not only transformed and renewed, but and is very much aware of God's will (Romans 12: 2).

The depth and quality of your relationship with God is directly dependent on the state of your heart. An untransformed and un-renewed heart is a heart that is not enlightened. A heart beclouded with bitterness, unforgiveness, faithlessness, doubt and fear is not renewed. A heart that is lustful is not enlightened. And a heart that is starved of the word of God is certainly not enlightened!

True transformation begins from the heart. Thus, to change your life, you must first change your heart. To stand firm with God, you must shift your attention from the affairs and cares of this world, and make constant, conscious and deliberate effort to keep your heart focused on the things of God. Daily study the Bible and chew on the word of God consistently. Be in regular communion with the Holy Spirit of God and yield your whole being to his leading always. Also, prayerfully ask God to enlighten your heart with His word as you make these efforts.

PAY YOUR DEBTS

Scripture: Exodus 22:14-15



"The wicked borrow and do not repay, but the righteous give generously." Psalm 37:21 (NIV)

Valuable relationships have been broken and destroyed due to people's refusal to repay debts owed others. Some people find it hard to return or repay when they borrow from others. When they need help, they persuasively get others to lend to them promising to repay. They, however, comfortably forget or postpone repayment without considering the needs or feelings of the people who have lent to them. This is not an attitude God approves of.

Everybody borrows at one point or another. It is, however, important to ensure that the debt is repaid when it becomes due. There is no excuse for any believer to take undue advantage of other people's kindness whether they are friends or family. The bible considers those who delay to repay their debt when they actually can or those who refuse to pay altogether as evil (Psalm 37:21a).

When you borrow from others, you must ensure to keep your word to pay back. If for any unforeseen circumstance, you are unable to pay, get the acceptance of the other party for an extended time. Do not expect them to or assume they will understand your situation. If what you have borrowed becomes damaged replace it or seek restitution with the owner (Ex. 22:14). Delay or complete refusal to do so puts you at the mercy of the lender and earns you God's judgement. God wants you to live debt free (Romans 13:7).

Lord, give me the grace to always pay back on time whenever I borrow in Jesus name.

Scripture: Haggai 1:1-10

1 Peter 4:10 (NIV)*

They perform tasks at levels far below their potentials and capabilities, believing that their secular jobs are more important because they receive direct financial reward. Feedback: How refreshing was your personal time with God?

Faith can be referred to as believing in God and what he can do, and acting on that belief. You cannot profess your faith when you do not act accordingly. It is important to recognize that the life of a Christian will amount to nothing without an unwavering belief in God's ability to do the impossible because without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews. 11:6).

The disciples of Jesus were not able to cast out the lunatic spirit from the little boy because they did not act in faith. They prayed and commanded the spirit but they did not believe that it would work. They were acting without faith. Jesus said if you believe and your corresponding action is in line with your belief, you will move mountains (Mark 11:23). Your action should be preceded by your faith.

Have you been faced with any form of mountain in your life just as the disciples faced the lunatic spirit? Are you passing through any challenges presently in your life? Jesus said if you believe without doubt and match your faith with action, nothing shall be impossible. You have the faith to do the impossible. You have the faith to break down every wall of limitation hindering your progress and upliftment. Act on your faith and bring it to pass.

Reflection: What propels my actions; unwavering belief in God or fear?

GIVE TO RECEIVE

Scripture: Proverbs 11:24-31

"I have shewed you all things, how that so labouring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive." Acts 20:35 (KJV)

Many believers suffer from lack due to their disobedience to the most basic principle of wealth creation - giving. Obedience to God's command to give is an act of submission to him. Giving is an affirmation of our love for God. It also symbolizes our acknowledgement that he is the provider of all we have (James 1:17).

The fear of lack and an uncertain future prevent many from keying into the blessings that come from giving. We withhold our resources believing that spending it on our own personal needs would ensure that it lasts longer and goes farther. This is far from the truth. God has given us abundantly and he wants us to give generously out of his blessings to us. When our giving is done with the purpose of pleasing God, we will not feel burdened, compelled or pressured to give.

Whenever we give, be it our time, talent or treasure, in the service of God and man, we must do so in faith. We need not be afraid of lack as God knows our needs and will meet us at the point we need it. There is never a best time to give. Everytime is the best time as long as we are led by the Spirit. We must glorify God with our giving. We must show him where our heart lies by giving to those in need and to the expansion of his Kingdom (Matthew 6:21). Our reward is in our giving (Luke 6:38). Remember God's promise to us that, "he that giveth...shall not lack." (Proverbs 28:27a).

THE POWER OF AGREEMENT

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 4:9-12



*"Again I say to you, that if two believers on earth agree [that is, are of one mind, in harmony] about anything that they ask [within the will of God], it will be done for them by My Father in heaven.
Matthew 18:19 (AMP)*

A tree cannot make a forest; it needs other trees to create one.. Similarly, your prayer alone is not enough to handle all the challenges that can confront you. You need to tap into the power of fellowship and agreement. You need to have believers who can join voice with you in prayer for an optimal and fruitful Christian experience (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10).

There is power in community (Matthew 18:20). Our key scripture today emphasizes that there is a formidable force and strength in partnership and agreement (Ecclesiastes 4:12). This synergy with others gives you an advantage as it provides a ready and constant support structure that you can access to uphold and encourage you physically and spiritually when you need it. There is strength in numbers and when you come together with other believers in faith, you can put a thousand to flight.

Come out of isolation and partner with other believers in prayer, worship, seed-sowing and fasting to challenge and change every stubborn situation facing you. The "me, myself and I" approach is not the best approach to getting the best out of your walk with God (Ecclesiastes 4:10). Christians need each other. Apply this principle deliberately diligently and watch your story change.

BE TEACHABLE

Scripture: Proverbs 15:1-12

"There is severe discipline for him who turns from the way (of righteousness); And he who hates correction will die."
Proverbs 15:10 (AMP)

Many believers are practising Christianity at their convenience. Many choose to ignore instructions from the church leadership; some take their leaders for granted, while others customise instructions to suit their self-interest. The bible warns that the one that refuses to be trained or taught shall be destroyed (Proverbs 15:10).

Correction and direction are useful only to the listening ear and obedient heart. Believers must not despise but embrace instruction. Remember the plight of Miriam when she opposed Moses' leadership. She became plagued with leprosy. God dealt with her immediately because her opposition to Moses would have resulted in direct disobedience to any instruction from him. Moses had to plead to God on her behalf for forgiveness before God had mercy on her (Numbers 12:1-16)

Glorify God by making the job of your pastors and leaders easier. Be willing and obedient. They are sent by God to spiritually guide you to follow the right direction. If you cannot be faithful and obedient to man that you can see then you can never be truly faithful to God whom you cannot see (Luke 16:10). Where you are today in life is as a result of an instruction you received or rejected. Obedience to instruction builds lives but obstinacy destroys it. Listen to your leaders and follow their instructions. Cooperate with God's servants and his blessings surround you (2 Chronicles 20:20b).

GODLY WISDOM

Scripture: Proverbs 8:1-13



"But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy." James 3:17 (KJV)

In seeking for wisdom, every believer must know that there are two types - the wisdom from God and the wisdom of the world. Without a clear picture of this, the believer that begins with godly wisdom may end up influenced, operating and entrapped by worldly wisdom.

This issue can play out in the marketplace where Christians who start out honest and fair in their dealings become swayed by the seemingly successful ways of unbelievers. In an attempt to imitate the "successful" ways of their peers, they discover and learn diverse ways to cut corners, cheat systems and manipulate the truth in order to appear productive and profitable. This often happens gradually and subtly with little or no realization that lines have been crossed. Godly wisdom models righteousness; it deals rightly, speaks truth and exhibits excellence. It does not operate in wickedness, does not speak perversely or deal deceitfully (Proverbs 8:6-8). Whenever we begin to think more about money or getting ahead more than our relationship with God, we have crossed a dangerous boundary.

As Children of God, we should remember that the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God (1 Corinthians 3:19) and the fear of the Lord is to the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 9:10). If our wisdom does not translate goodness to others, shine God's light on situations or bring glory to God, it is not the wisdom that comes from God.

Lord, I refuse to choose the wisdom of this world over the wisdom that comes from you in Jesus name.

FAITH BYTE

Scripture: Daniel 9:1-19

*"I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people.
Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf..."*
1 Timothy 2:1 (NLT)

THE GOOD FOUNDATION

Scripture: 1 Timothy 6:11-21



*"Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth
but not have a rich relationship with God."
Luke 12:21 (NLT)*

The world's advice for people who wish for financial freedom and stability is to ensure a portfolio of savings and investments that enables them to take care of present and future needs. Sometimes, in the quest to secure this good life, you can compromise to the standards of the world and rob yourself of the opportunity for true riches that comes from doing what really counts to God.

Paul cautions everyone who has been blessed with wealth to focus on being rich in good work; being liberal and generous at heart as these are sure ways of laying a good foundation for the future. A heart that takes pleasure in these earthly riches soon forgets that they are fleeting and uncertain. Jesus gave an account of a rich fool who was rich toward himself and not in God (Luke 12:13-21). He failed to realize that his wealth was a privilege from God and he needed to use it to glorify God.

It is paramount that while you are in the business of making wealth in this world, you should not forget to lay your foundation on the only One that can guarantee you stability no matter the wave of uncertainty that blows your way. Your foundation and trust must be in God (Matthew 7:24). Constantly assess your life and priorities. You can never go wrong when you look to God for surety. Remember, they that put their trust in God shall not be put to shame.

Feedback: How refreshing was your study of the word of God?

God can play any role we desire him to in our lives. We can relate with him as Creator, King, Father, Lord, Provider, Healer and more. However, we sometimes forget that he can also be a righteous Judge (Psalm 97:2). It is this role that ensures that the upright receives justice and eternal blessing. As Christians, we miss out on a lot when we fail to relate to God as our righteous Judge.

The five daughters of Zelophehad, descendants of Joseph understood from the laws that God gave Moses, that God was interested in Justice, fairness and equity. As such when they believed that they were being treated unfairly, they presented their case before Moses – God's oracle. When Moses enquired of God, God immediately told Moses that the daughters were correct to ask for their father's inheritance. They presented their case to God and got judgment in their favour.

The beauty of our dispensation is that now we have a mediator and advocate that is greater than Moses. His name is Jesus and he is also God. What are you passing through? Who is mistreating you or depriving you of your rights? Present your case to God the righteous judge, with him on your side, any situation can surely turn in your favour.

Reflection: If I really believe that God is just, wouldn't I pray more?

Scripture: Proverbs 4:21-27

"Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it [are] the issues of life." Proverbs 4:23 (KJV)

There is something really special about the heart of man. The prophet Samuel revealed that God does not evaluate people by outward appearance, but he looks at the heart (1 Samuel 16:7). The heart can also be blind thus apostle Paul prayed for the saints that "the eyes of your heart may be enlightened" (Ephesians 1:18). God wants us to trust in him with all our heart; and never our own understanding (Proverbs 3: 5) and to store his word in our heart (Psalm 119:11).

Jesus declared that we should love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Mark 12:30). ENGAGE YOUR GIFT

Scripture: 1 Timothy 4:6-16



"Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery."

1 Timothy 4:14 (KJV)

There is absolutely no one in life that does not have a gift put in him by God. The challenge, however, lies in the fact that many do not realise that they have been given a gift. Others, on the other hand, neglect to put theirs to use. A gift that has not been discovered and put to use cannot benefit you or others.

It is important for us to know that our gifts are a blessing to others and this means that destinies are tied to our gifts when we put it to use to God's glory. Starting from your family, ministry church and then to the society at large. Your gift may not be like others but that one that God has given you is what you need to be all that God wired you to be, therefore engage it diligently.

Scripture: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

We live in a society where nothing seems to be evil anymore. Perverse behaviours and actions that were unthinkable in the past are permitted and celebrated in the world. There is a high level of compromise even in the body of Christ. We must refuse to condone these or allow them corrupt and influence our thinking or perspective.

OBTAIN A GOOD REPORT

Scripture: 1 Timothy 3:1-16



"Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil."

1 Timothy 3:7 (KJV)

The bible recognizes that in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and of silver but also of wood and earth, some to honour and others to dishonour (2 Timothy 2:20). This implies that, although many come to church and profess to love and serve God, their actions may not please God or bring glory to him. This is why it goes on to warn that everyone who names the name of the Lord should depart from iniquity (2 Timothy 2:19).

The Christian lifestyle demands that we develop and live exemplary lives. It is a lifestyle that demands discipline. We cannot afford to bring the name of the Lord to disrepute by our actions. We must walk our talk and live in a way that will encourage people around us to become curious about what makes the difference in our lives. It is a place of interaction and bonding with God. It is a sure way of spending time with God and a means to abide under the Shadow of his protection (v1).

Certain persons today enjoy benefits and favour in positions they seem not best suited or qualified for. There are others whose past were totally in desolation but have found complete fullness in their lives today. This is evidence of God's divine enablement and favour. One thing becomes clear when divine enablement is at work – it goes beyond your asking and ability.

Paul enjoyed undeserved grace from God who counted him worthy and faithful to serve in ministry. Even he could not justify why God chose him. Despite his previous actions, God showered his grace on him abundantly and chose him to lead the crusade to the Gentiles. Countless people of God have enjoyed this benevolence of grace and love from God. Moses killed as a result of anger; Rahab was a harlot; David masterminded Uriah's death and took his wife but God still showed all of them love and enabled them to accomplish his purpose.

It is better to realise that the position you function in or the great strides you have attained are a result of God's divine enablement and strength. His love and mercy has justified and qualified you. Acknowledge and keep thanking God for where he has brought you thus far; he will turn things in your favour and enable you beyond your human strength and limitation.

USE THE RIGHT WORDS

Scripture: Proverbs 15:1-24

*"...And a word spoken in due season, how good is it!"
Proverbs 15:23b (KJV)*

Feedback: Consider what happen when you pray for others.

We communicate with people everyday as we go about our routine activities using words as our primary tool. Our choice of words in communicating is thus essential as it leaves specific impressions about us and trigger certain reactions from others.

The words we speak are powerful in that they can determine the outcome or experience we enjoy from our interaction with others. Although, in many places, cultures and tradition to a great extent determine what and how people speak and interact with others, one can never go wrong with ensuring that their words are always kind (Proverbs 15:23). Careless words spoken in anger or jest can hurt others and cause conflict. Our intention may not have been to hurt the other party but when we speak unguardedly, we risk causing avoidable tension.

Remember that a gentle answer turns away wrath and a good word at the right time brings joy (Proverbs 15:1, 23). Keep guard over what you say. No matter how harmless a statement may seem to you, consider its impact on the others before you use it. Because a believer is the salt of the earth, make every word you speak tasteful.

Reflection: What is it that provokes me to make careless statements?

Scripture: 1 Timothy 4:6-16



*"For God is not a God of disorder but of peace -
as in all the congregations of the saints."
1 Corinthians 14:33 (NIV)*

Folklore and myths are traditional beliefs and customs of a community passed down through word of mouth across several generations. Some of these traditions can hinder our spiritual growth, therefore, God makes it clear that we must completely do away with these old and detrimental belief systems in our lives if we must live effectively as true Christians.

We are not only instructed to shun ungodly traditions but to constantly admonish others to do the same (v6). Some believers still attend ungodly traditional meetings and participate in some community practices that do not glorify God. Some world religions go to the extent of blending ungodly traditional practices into the Christian doctrines to form their versions of Christianity. The bible condemns such practices (1 Timothy 4:12).

We worship one true God who has redeemed us through his son Jesus (1 Corinthians 8:6). By our faith in him, we are free from every negative tradition and myth (Romans 8:1-2). God is not the author of confusion (1 Corinthians 14:33a). We ought therefore, not to bring ungodly traditions and customs in our walk with God, or let it influence our faith in Him. The Christian walk has no connection with worldly traditions so we must be mindful not to confuse them with God's instructions to us. Rather than succumb to what the world dictates, we must influence our community and environment and with God's way.

CHRISTLIKE ATTITUDE

Scripture: Proverbs 22:1-18

"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6 (KJV)

It is imperative to be a source of relief to the poor amongst us and to help them the best way we can. Unfortunately, many avoid this and shy away from obeying this God-given command. We often prefer to give to the rich, who themselves live in abundance, in the erroneous belief that giving to the rich will bring us favour and reward.

Taking advantage of the poor to enrich self is disastrous as it is a sure way of bringing God's punishment upon oneself. The same fate awaits those who further enrich the wealthy to the detriment or disadvantage of the poor. God does not expect us to withhold from the poor, or refuse to share with them. He demands unconditional kindness from those who are blessed, towards those who are less privileged or are in need amongst us. God has deep concern for the poor and expects us to do same. Remember, he who gives to the poor lends to God; and God does not owe.

We must forsake the selfish attitude of expecting rewards for every good deed we do to others. Give help and support to those in need with a cheerful attitude and do not make the mistake of looking down on them, or getting boastful because you are a giver. Practice giving today and you will begin to see the joy and rewards that it brings.

REMEMBER EVERY KINDNESS

Scripture: Judges 8:29-35



"But then I recall all you have done..."
Psalms 77:11a (NIV)

Not long after Gideon died, the children of Israel forgot God and also did not remember the kindness that Gideon had shown them. They returned to the worship of Baal. They allowed the killing of all but one of Gideon's sons and made the killer their king.

There are many people today who act like those Israelites who existed after Gideon's demise. They forget deeds of kindness shown them once they perceive that their situation has improved. They forget the sacrifices others made to get them to their current status in life. David is a good example to us on how to react to the kindness of others. He went to great lengths to seek out Mephibosheth because his father, Jonathan, had at one time been good to him (2 Samuel 9:7).

Never belittle any help you receive at any time no matter how insignificant it may seem. It is important to learn to value and acknowledge the help of others. Sometimes, a simple 'thank you' will do. People have been known to show kindness to the children of those who have helped them. As you open the door of blessing to others through whom God has blessed you, you leave open the door of blessing to yourself.

Proverbs 16:32 (NLT)

Emotions are a very sensitive part of our lives. This is because, if not properly managed and controlled, it can have a detrimental impact on our lives. Not every situation deserves a reaction especially when aimed at belittling your faith.

As Jesus was to be arrested, Peter acted based on his emotions which beclouded his sense of reasoning at that point in time. Peter had no right to act the way he did because no matter the circumstance, there is always a non-violent way out. He did not master his emotions. Acting calm and composed in the midst of problems shows a high level of maturity and it is only then that you can make rational decisions.

As a Christian, you need to control your emotions. No matter the situations or your feelings about any issue, you should always remember that there is nothing God cannot fix. The most important thing is having a consciousness that God is always in control. Take a step back and assess the situation. Never try to act in the heat of the moment. You have the mind of Christ and therefore, let his peace guard your reaction. Do not let your emotions overwhelm you and make a mockery of your faith. Always ask God for grace to stay calm and rely on him for direction to tackle every situation.

Scripture: Proverbs 20:1-12



*"Indeed, there is not a righteous man on earth

Ecclesiastes 7:20 (AMP)*

The overconfident and self-righteous Christian is a source of constant offense to God (Proverbs 8:13). He is also a discouragement to other believers because they will find it difficult to relate with him due to his claim of perfection. When Christians act self-righteous, they push others away because their lifestyle appears unattainable and unrealistic.

The scripture declares that self-righteousness is a sin (1 John 1:8) because such a believer will not depend on God but will rely on his ability and strength. Any believer who believes he can succeed by his own strength is at risk of eventual downfall (1 Corinthians 10:12). Every Christian has weaknesses which can only be overcome daily by the grace of God for the strength of God is made perfect in our weakness (2 Corinthians 12:8-9).

Knowledge is gotten through learning and experience but wisdom is a unique gift from God that can be gotten by earnestly seeking for it from God for He alone gives wisdom (v6). If, for example, you realize that your house is sitting on an oil well, nothing else will be relevant until you have dug and discovered the oil. This should be the mindset of any one whose desire is to acquire wisdom.

Clear insight and knowledge of God will be yours as things and events will be orchestrated in your favour (v5b). God's wisdom is available for you if you genuinely seek it from Him.

Many people stay committed to things or people simply because they believe and expect they will receive favours from them. They do not believe in going through the thick and thin in any matter or relationship. For these people, if there is nothing to gain, then there is no place for them. Our commitment to anything should go beyond benefits, it should be driven and motivated by love, it should stand the test of time and the wave of trials. This is the kind of loyalty God asks of us.

As a Christian, loyalty is a basic quality that you should have whether in your service to God, man or any righteous cause ((Proverbs 17:17: Romans 3:1-2). Scripture: Proverbs 9:1-12

Proverbs 9:10 (NLT)

If it was possible to purchase wisdom with money, inherit it from parents or receive it as a reward for something, then it will be within the reach of all; both believers and unbelievers. The scriptures remind us that the fear of the Lord is the bedrock of wisdom. How can you make it through life without wisdom and how can you have wisdom without the fear of God?

People love to be associated with the wise, hence, the Queen of Sheba travelled all the way to Israel to listen to Solomon (1 Kings. 10:1-10). The tongue is a mighty weapon that has the power to build or destroy depending on how it is used. It can make the difference in a conflict or dispute. The hedge of God is God's total and perpetual protective covering over a man's entire life. Riches and the desire for it should not make you compromise your faith by acting in ways that are in contravention to God's laws. You do not have to flow with the crowd. You are different so act different. If your whole office subscribes to taking bribes you should be the one to stand out. Even if it may look like they are all richer than you, the legacy you are creating for yourself will last even to the end of time and will ultimately speak for you in heaven.

A HARD TARGET

Scripture: Ephesians 6:10-20



"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." 1 Peter 2:9 (AMP)

Many people are so "modernized" that they feel the devil does not exist and this is their greatest undoing. The devil will always provoke you with temptations and trials but you must not let him succeed. The day you gave your life to Christ and decided to serve God is the same day you became a prime target of the enemy.

God has given you the grace and means to overcome every persecution of the devil against your life, business and family. When you are alive and vibrant for Christ in prayers, service and sacrifice, you do not only become an impossibly tough target, you also become a kingdom enforcer for God and a reference point of His awesomeness in your time and generation. Always be prepared by furnishing yourself with the necessary equipment and you will successfully resist and overpower the enemy on all fronts (Ephesians 6:11)

APPLY DISCRETION

Scripture: Proverbs 2:10-15

*"Do not forsake wisdom, and she will protect you;"
Proverbs 4:6 (NIV)*

A Christian that lacks the wisdom and understanding to survive in the world today will constantly be pulled down. We should strive to possess the quality of having good judgment and this can only be possible by the help of the Holy Spirit.

Do not be entrapped by the attractions the world offers such that you can no longer differentiate between right and wrong. God wants us to live a good and comfortable life but we must be careful who we relate with, what we listen to and what we say. Do not let your godly character be dampened by conforming to every doctrine that comes your way. Slowly and subtly, giving in to the ways of the world will ultimately corrupt the godly character in you. You cannot be friends with everyone, you cannot be part of every discussion and you cannot be seen at all places. You should endeavor to be careful, avoid bad company and flee from evil practices. Mind the invitations you honour with your presence.

The word of God can make you wise and discreet in your conduct but the key to achieving this is through studying the word, meditation, and prayer. Being in tune with God will open your eyes to discerning between good and evil, giving you understanding that will put you on your guard to watch against any vice that can lead you astray.

It is quite unfortunate when a child grows up without a father or worse as an orphan, without parental love. Such a child is vulnerable, unguided and most critically "unprotected". A person is spiritually unprotected until they become God's own and this is done by simply accepting His Son Jesus Christ in principle and practice. The sooner you accept Him as your Father, the sooner you can possess and activate your inheritance of divine protection.

Only the true sons and daughters of God who in obedience have truly accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour and are led by the Spirit of God can enjoy the covering that comes with being children of God. Feedback: How refreshing was your personal devotion with God?

Fathers are placed over children to guide, protect and provide for them. In order to nurture them in the path of success, fathers always instruct their children from their wealth of experience and wisdom. Some instructions may seem harsh or very difficult but are usually given with the best intentions at heart and the wellbeing of the child as the ultimate focus.

When God instructs us, he expects us to obey. He expects us to walk in the path that he has created for us. We can never go wrong when we hearken to God's instructions because his thoughts for us are always good to keep us on the path of light. Even when he rebukes us, it is solely for our benefit. It should be the same with our earthly fathers. Their instructions could come in the form of rebuke; it could also come as a reward to recognize good behavior. No matter what form it comes in, the purpose is to groom and train the child to fulfill their God given purpose on earth. This does not rule out the fact that there are father figures who may lead you astray.

Therefore, it is our responsibility to test every instruction received, from those we regard as father figures, with the word of God. If an instruction you receive is not in line with God's word, it is not what God, your heavenly father wants for you. When you know and obey God's instruction you will not be led astray by ungodly fathers.

Reflection: Do I easily identify the instruction that comes from God?

"Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment."
1 Timothy 6:17 (NIV)

Money is good and answereth all things. The Church needs money to expand, the Christian needs money to survive on earth, therefore, money itself is not the problem. The problem is the attitude of man towards it. People are ready to go to any length and even sell their souls to be rich. For many people today, lying and cheating is the natural thing to do to become rich. People have been so enslaved by the facade of rich living that they have forsaken God.

If you were dead, of what use would money be to you? Without air to breathe, how would you enjoy the riches you strive so hard to acquire? Who provides the air you breathe today? Whose power has kept you alive till now? Definitely not money! Money should never take the place of God in your life. Do not become so consumed by the luxury and comfort money provides that you forget who made it possible for you to get that money in the first place. If you put money before God, you will pay a hefty price (Proverbs 11:28).

The glory and honour that belongs to God should never be shared with anyone or anything. Seek first the kingdom of God and other things shall be added to your life. God alone is worthy of worship, not any man nor any idol and definitely not money. Money should work for you, and not the other way round.

GODLY ACQUISITION

Scripture: Proverbs 8:17-30

"My fruit is better than gold, yea, than fine gold; and my revenue than choice silver."

Proverbs 8:19 (KJV)

Everyone aspires to live the good life, including Christians. We all want to be rich, live in fine homes, drive good cars, marry and have beautiful children. These are legitimate and godly aspirations. What is critical is how you get the good things of life. To God, the end does not justify the means at all.

God wants you to become rich the right way. To make godly wealth, you have to realise that God is in possession of riches in abundance and also understand that riches acquired in a godly way will endure. (Proverbs 8v19) Don't dip your hands into evil doings because of a thirst for earthly acquisition, as any ill-gotten wealth is unacceptable to God. When God blesses you with wealth, it will not cause you to sorrow or have any repercussions (Proverbs 10:22) but ill-gotten wealth has no lasting value. (Proverbs 10v2)

Abhor the ungodly wealth creation strategies of the wicked. Believe that God can enrich you and then commit to getting riches the right way. Also remember that when you use your riches to glorify God, you are indeed a worthy carrier of the gift of God.

PRIORITIZED GIVING

Scripture: Deuteronomy 26:1-11



"Honour the Lord with your possessions, And with the firstfruits of all your increase;"
Proverbs 3:9 (NKJV)

The general attitude of many when it comes to giving is to bring to God leftovers, after every other need has been met. This is wrong. Every other need, no matter how urgent and important in our consideration and circumstance should take second place after honouring God the giver of all things. Nothing should take God's place in your giving order. This is exactly what the principle of first fruits is all about, God should be given the first place before anything else.

The first fruit principle refers to the practice of giving to God the first and the best portion of your harvest. Many people give God the leftovers. No matter how sincere and willing you may be, the attitude of not prioritizing your giving to God first puts you backward. It is better to give God the first part of your income, because it demonstrates that God takes priority in your life and that your resources belong to Him. Giving God first also secures and sanctifies the rest and opens you up to receive God's special blessings.

Learn to put God first in everything you do including your finances. When you do so, the rest is sanctified and secured for your sufficient use. There will be a ceaseless flow of God's resources towards you that will guarantee abundance in your life. Use the principle of first fruits to set up a system of continuous flow of heavenly resources in your life.

There are a lot of smart people everywhere in the world today but just how far can intelligence take anyone? Without total trust in God and surrender to Him, you can only get as far as your brain can comprehend but when you are backed up by the all-knowing God, there is no limit to what you can achieve. (Isaiah 46:10). You cannot claim to have trust in God when you still rely on your physical knowledge to handle your situations. Feedback: Consider the benefits of studying God's word.

God's word can help shape our mindset and build up our faith in him but philosophy based on the wisdom of men contrary to the knowledge of God can ruin our faith. These principles are built after the tradition of men and the rudiments of the world rather than the word of God. Any philosophy contrary to the word of God is from the devil.

Paul warned the Colossians to beware of enticing but deceitful words of men. The bible notes that by good words and fair speeches many are deceived (Romans 16:18). You must stand guard against enticing words, and be careful lest you go with what appears to be the popular or accepted opinion rather than God's word. Do not accept a saying because it sounds reasonable or is popular. If it is not in line with the word of God, discard it. Be rooted and built up in Christ, very firmly established in faith as this is the only way to escape the enticing words of evil deceivers. It is within your power to resist man's wisdom over God's wisdom (Proverbs. 1:10).

The closer your walk with God, the stronger you will become established in the faith. Ensure your words and actions are in agreement with the teachings of the Bible. Ask God today for the grace to be rooted in faith and diligently follow his teachings.

Reflection: Where do I put my trust; God's word OR popular beliefs?

In an attempt to deal with the fear, some resort to substance abuse while some enter into destructive relationships. They usually end up in a bigger mess than where they started. THE DANGER OF INDECISION

Scripture: James 1:2-15



*"But since you are like lukewarm water, neither hot nor cold,
I will spit you out of my mouth!"
Revelation 3:16 (NLT)*

Hesitation, procrastination and distractions are the outcomes of indecision. The Greek word for double-mindedness "dipsuchos", literally translates as two-minded; that is someone being pulled in two different directions, constantly shifting between decisions. For this person it is impossible to ever steadily commit to anything. Such a man or woman is unstable emotionally, financially and spiritually.

No one feels happy when what is due them is intentionally delayed; yet we often find ourselves doing so to others. Postponement or procrastination of any event that will lead to loss for the next person, with no tangible reason is not a character any Christian should exhibit.

Do not indulge in acts that are abominable to God simply because you want to teach certain people a lesson. When you hold back from helping those around you even when it is in your power to do so, you incur the anger of God (Proverbs 3:33). It could be you on the receiving end tomorrow. THE ROD OF CORRECTION

Scripture: Proverbs 23:7-14



*"Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child;
but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him."
Proverbs 22:15 (KJV)*

Children are by default, prone to foolish deeds because they have little or no knowledge of the consequences of their actions. It takes the extra effort of good and godly parents to grow young children, especially in this modern era, into responsible and wise adults. One of the ways parents raise good children is through prompt and continuous correction. The Bible instructs that the rod be used for correcting children. The rod must be used to instill discipline in erring children, and not to vent our frustration, show disapproval, or punish them for their misdeeds. In other words, the rod must be used to correct, and not to punish.

Some parents avoid the use of the rod in correcting their children, because they do not want to hurt their children. They forget that it is better to make a child bear the little pain of correction now, than to endure the heavy devastation that comes from lack of godly parental discipline in the future.

We must not shy away from using the rod of discipline to correct those under us. We must live up to the responsibility of training everyone that God has put in our care. God corrects those He loves (Proverbs 3:12). As God's children, we must emulate Him by lovingly using the rod to correct our children and everyone in our care.

THE POTENCY OF PRAYER

Scripture: James 5:13-18

*"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NIV)*

Prayer is a strong weapon that can be used to overcome every problem. This simple yet potent tool can make or break a man, heal nations, and transform the world. It is unfortunate that most believers don't exercise the power that has been provided by God to beat hard circumstances. This power can be accessed through prayer offered in faith.

Scripture: John 16:25-33

Proverbs 24:10 (KJV)*

No one likes to face adversity, but it is a part of life. Accepting Christ into our hearts does not exempt us from the trials of life but there is the hope and assurance of victory because Jesus Christ said so. There will be tribulations, but we must not lose faith because He has overcome the world. God has enabled us to overcome and have peace in the midst of trials by sending His son Jesus to die for us.

We must draw strength to stand in the days of adversity from the words of Jesus. The Word of God instructs us to avoid envying the achievement of those who do not fear God, since the Lord will abundantly reward those who revere him in due time.

You might compare yourself to people who are unsaved but doing better than you according to your assessment, but do you realize that their end is not guaranteed? Scripture: James 1:13-18

*"Temptation comes from our own desires,
which entice us and drag us away."
James 1:14 (NLT)*

When you fail to master your desires, you become a slave to them and move in whatever direction they push you. An improper desire that is not controlled can cause you to take actions that lead to regret.

It is a natural human tendency to desire the good things of life but when the need to achieve your desires influences you to steal, cheat or deceive to obtain them or get results, then temptation has won the battle. PLANT THE RIGHT SEED

Scripture: Galatians 6:710



*"My experience shows that those who plant trouble
and cultivate evil harvest the same."
Job 4:8 (NLT)*

For those who sow good deeds, the phrase "you reap what you sow" is great news but a scary one for those who engage in evil deeds. Some people sow in the flesh while some sow in the spirit. You sow in the flesh when you indulge and feed your fantasies through giving in to your anger, bitterness and lust (Galatians 5:19-21). However, when you feed your spirit man, you sow in the spirit.

God's grace is available and sufficient to save you from sin, erase your mistakes and translate you to being a replica of his marvelous image. It does not matter how terrible you think your sin or crime is, turn to God and talk to him and his mercy and grace will envelope you.

Scripture: 2 Timothy 3:10-17

He reigns supreme forevermore.

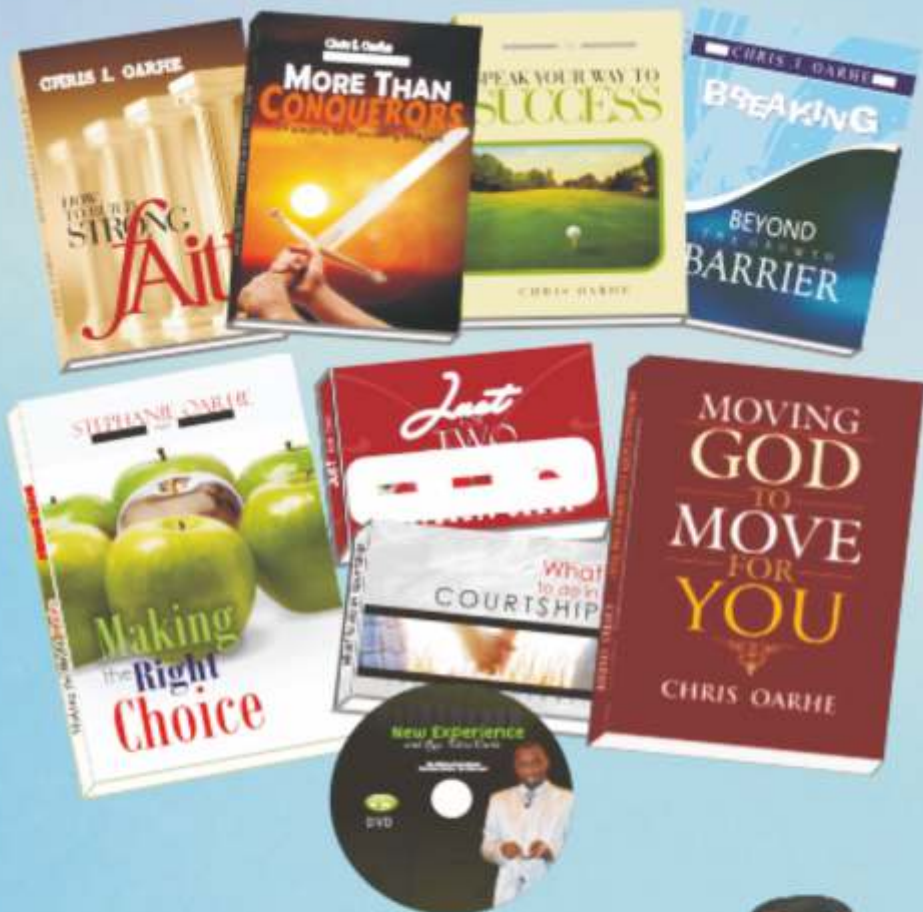
